KNOW BEFORE YOU GO !!

Before heading to the polls, please make sure your registration is up to date so your vote will count on Nov. 8. See below for Board of Elections contact information.

Using One-Stop Early Voting is also the best way to vote if your registration is not up to date.

There are 3 ways to vote in NC:

#1: VOTE BY MAIL: From Oct. 7 to Nov. 1, you can request an Absentee Ballot – a ballot that is mailed to the address you specify and then mailed back after you complete it. You do not need an excuse to vote with an Absentee Ballot. To obtain an Absentee Ballot, you or a near relative must write your local Board of Elections; do **not** use a pre-filled out form. Send a simple letter with the voter's name, address of registration and date of birth, where the Absentee Ballot should be mailed to, and the signature of the voter or the person making the request for the voter. If the request is from a relative, it must also include that person's name, address and relationship to the voter. It is also a good idea to include a phone number or email address in case your Board of Elections needs to contact you for any reason. Follow the instructions sent with the Ballot very carefully.

#2: VOTE EARLY IN PERSON. From Oct. 20 to Nov.5, you can vote by going to any One-Stop Early Voting site in your county. Going to one of these sites is also the best way to vote if you have moved within your county or if you are not registered yet and want to use Same Day Registration.

3: VOTE ON ELECTION DAY. On November 8, vote at your precinct's voting place (your "polling place") between 6:30 AM and 7:30 PM. Your precinct is based on your home address and appears on the voter card mailed to you when you registered. You do **not** need the card to vote. Call your Board of Elections or check the websites on the back cover of this guide to find your polling place. **NOTE: 13 election day voting locations have been relocated. Call 704-336-2133 or visit their website at www.meckboe.org.**

The Basics on Voting in North Carolina



... if you can answer "Yes" to all three of these questions:

- 1) Are you a U.S. citizen?
- 2) Will you be at least 18 on Election Day, Nov. 8?
- 3) Will you live at your address for at least 30 days before Election Day?

You have the right to vote....

These are the basic requirements and they mean that you can vote if you are a student living on campus; or an ex-felon who has finished your sentence, including probation; or a person awaiting trial or serving a misdemeanor sentence; or a person who cannot read; or someone who has only lived in NC for a month before Nov. 8. **But you must register before you vote.**

Registering to vote is easy!

To register, you fill out a form that asks for your name, address and birth date. You need to provide your NC driver's license



number or the last 4 digits of your Social Security number or another form of identification (or be prepared to show ID when you first vote). Other acceptable forms of ID include a utility bill (phone, gas, etc.), bank statement, paycheck stub or any government document with your residential address on it. Homeless people can list a shelter as their address. You can ask for help filling out the form if you need it.

To obtain a form, call or visit your local Board of Elections or call 1-866-522-4723. You can also get a registration form at any public library, high school, or Department of Social Services, public health, or Division of Motor Vehicles office. Or you can print a form from this website: www.sboe.state.nc.us. If the library or other office does not promise to mail in the

form, mail it yourself to your local Board of Elections. By two weeks later, you should receive a voter card with information about your precinct and where to vote.

What if I am a student?

You may register in your old hometown and vote there – or you can declare your new address as your home, even if it's a dorm on campus, because that is where you go "home" day after day.

When to register:

There are two deadlines when it comes to registering to vote. If you choose to mail in your form or give it to another person to turn in, the form must be submitted to the Board of Elections by Oct. 14. Or you can use Same Day Registration and register in person at a One-Stop, Early Voting center in your county from Oct. 20—Nov 5. See details below:

Help! It's after Oct. 14th... can I still register to vote?!

Don't panic! You can register (and vote on the same day) using Same Day Registration & Voting (SDR) during the statewide One-Stop, Early Voting period from Oct. 20-Nov. 5..

But you cannot use Same Day Registration on Election Day. To use SDR, visit an Early Voting location in your county (See back page of this Voter Guide). You need to show election officials one of these IDs with your name and current address: a NC driver's license, utility bill, bank statement, paycheck stub, student ID with a school document showing your address or a license, permit, bill or any other government document.

What if I changed my name?

To avoid problems when you vote, whenever your personal information changes, you should fill out a new voter registration form. If you haven't done this by Oct. 8, it's best to vote at an Early Voting site where you can update your registration.



Unpacking? Be sure to update!

You must change your voter registration when you move to a new county. And even if you've moved within the same county, you should update your registration. Use the same form as a new voter but fill out an extra section asking for your old address so the state can cancel your old registration and assign you a new polling place. If you moved within the same county and forgot to change your registration, go to an Early Voting site during the Early Voting period or go to your old polling place on Election Day and ask for a "Provisional Ballot."

Can I vote if I am an ex-felon?

Yes. You temporarily lose your citizenship rights if you are convicted of a felony. But, no matter where you were convicted, your rights are automatically restored in NC after you serve your complete sentence, including probation or parole. You don't need a special document – just register and vote like any other citizen.

Do you have a loved one serving in the military?

Voters outside the U.S. or in the military can vote using an Absentee Ballot (see details at right) and have the option of faxing or scanning their Absentee Ballot request and sending it in as an attachment to an email – contact your local Board of Elections for details.

- Continuing Weighted Student Staffing, which has been proven to narrow the achievement gap by allocating extra staff to schools based on the number of Economically Disadvantaged students
- Identifying successful educational partnerships within the community—tap into and support these already existing resources, help to eliminate bureaucratic roadblocks so that more students can benefit from these programs.
- Hosting "Student Summits" in which I'll connect with students in person and via social media. We'll jointly explore the challenges and opportunities in our education system, and I'll seek to learn from the perspective of our students.

- 1) Galvanizing magnet school parents to mitigate the challenges (i.e., program attrition) associated with the roll-out of the Shuttle Stop program. With another parent leader, I co-led the effort that brought over 400 parents together to discuss the challenges and formulate solutions.
- 2) Participating in the Achieve Together Advocacy training program. Achieve Together, a project of The Lee Institute, is a community partnership that connects local residents with people, training, data and support to become advocates for positive change in the CMS. The goal is to collectively push for constructive changes that will improve student achievement and graduation rates.
- 3) Being appointed to and serving on the Meck. Co. Crime & Justice Task Force, a 14-member, non-partisan Rapid Review Team tasked with identifying and recommending opportunities for immediate and substantive changes to the operations of city, county and state criminal justice agencies in the County to enhance effectiveness.

What qualities or experience do you bring that will make you an effective school board member? (1000 character limit): I am a thoughtful leader who is concerned with moving this community forward. Over the last decade, I have served on a number of local boards and I have had the privilege of serving my community as the leader of two non-profit agencies with large boards. This work has taught me how to work within the board/staff leader governance structure. I would bring that understanding and expertise to the table and use it to create working agreements with my colleagues as well as the interim and incoming Superintendent. I have also developed positive working relationships with a number of the current and previous CMS board members.

Professionally, my skill sets include: Budget Mgmt. (Operating/Capital), Contracts/Negotiations/Compliance, Data Collection/Analysis, Public Speaking/Presentations, Strategic Planning/Project Mgmt., Diversity/Inclusion Trainer, Facilities Mgmt., Community Engagement, Grant Writing, Recruiting/Hiring Staff, Six Sigma Green Belt, and Clifton Strength Finder Coach.

My desire to run for school board is an extension of my continued desire to serve this community. I am committed to improving the quality of our public school system and realize that serving as a policy maker is one of the most direct ways to make a difference.

Question Provided by Kids Voting: What is the most important accomplishment you will make next year that will directly impact CMS students, not their teachers or parents? (1250 character limit): Increase the level of expectation for CMS students. Ensure that each child in the district receives a quality education by:

- placing a well trained, highly effective teacher in every classroom for Day 1 to Day 180
- assigning a team of prepared and engaged administrators to each school over a continuous period of time to ensure continuity
- providing an instructional program that gives each student a strong literacy foundation, solid STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) experiences and critical thinking skills starting in elementary school
- directing resources toward activities that increase academic gains and professional development opportunities for teachers
- engaging parents, businesses and the faith community in public/private partnerships

I also want to lay the groundwork to create a county-wide youth leadership program for high school and middle school students in CMS. Each school would have delegate representation. Delegates will work together with the Board and school administrators to address issues that are important to students. The program will foster civic involvement, leadership, and entrepreneurial experience that will help prepare students to become productive citizens.

List up to three (3) of your most important political/civic accomplishments in the last five (5) years. (1000 character limit): 1- In 2009 when CMS would not maintain the schools over the summer I organized a group of folks to do that work. Question Provided by Kids Voting: What is the most important accomplishment you will make next year that will directly impact CMS students, not their teachers or parents? (1250 character limit): I certainly think if I am elected the first order of business is to hire a superintendent. That would impact the entire educational system in my eyes. We are currently on a 2014 plan that never accounted for a recession. Well one happened and continues to happen. We must be flexible enough to be able to change on as dictated and this clearly is not happening. I strongly feel we need a superintendent that will be here for 8-10 years and lead the system back with the board's assistance/direction. I feel with the correct decisions by the board we can increase grade levels by 10-12% within 3 years.

Only about 30% of students enter on grade level, but more than 90% leave proficient on end of grade tests.

I served four years and was chair of the board of directors at The Community Charter School for two years, where we turned our staff's instructional priorities into our board's budget priorities to raise our Math scores by 20% and have a budget surplus. Finally, as a member of Leadership Charlotte Class 32, I volunteered

at Windsor Park elementary school to raise parent involvement in Parent University.

(1000 character limit): I have teaching experience closing the achievement gap in my classroom, administrative experience working shoulder to shoulder with teachers across CMS - from schools like West Charlotte to Garinger, and board experience engaging educators and the community to build bridges and make smart choices for students. 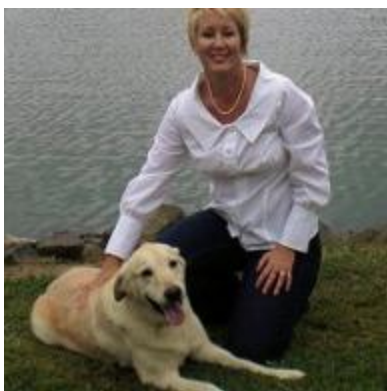

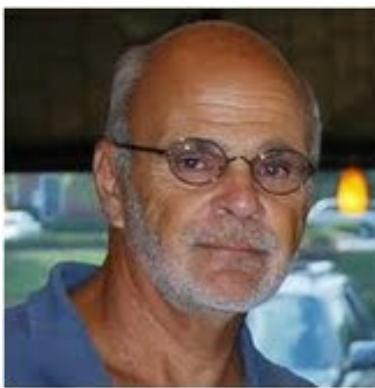

The NC Voter Bill of Rights

In North Carolina, you have the RIGHT TO VOTE . . .

1. . . . **between 6:30 am and 7:30 pm on Election Day**, or if you are in line or inside the polling place before the polls close at 7:30 pm. (NC General Statute (NCGS 163-166.01)
2. . . . **without presenting any identification or your voter registration card to poll workers.** (NCGS 163-82.8) However, if you are a first-time voter who registered to vote by mail without providing a NC driver's license or Social Security number or other identification, it makes sense to take with you a current and valid photo ID, or a document showing your name and current address, such as a current utility bill, bank statement, or a bill, license, permit, letter or other document from a government agency. (NCGS 163-166.12)
3. . . . **by provisional ballot** if you submitted a voter registration form in the county, but your name is not on the rolls; or if you believe you've registered but your name is not on the list; or if you question the voting district (or ballot) assigned to you and believe that you are qualified to vote a different ballot. (N.C. Administrative Code 10B.0103d.) You must also be given a way to find out whether the provisional ballot was counted, and if not, the reason it was not counted. (NCGS 163-166.11(3))
4. . . **at your same assigned polling place**, if you have moved within the same precinct or changed your name without telling election officials. (NCGS 163-82.15, 163-82.16)
5. . . **in your new precinct or at a central location** if you have moved and lived in your new location for 30 days or more. If you moved and have lived in your new location for less than 30 days, you must vote in your old precinct, cast a provisional ballot in your new precinct, or vote early at an Early Voting site in your county. (NCGS 163-82.15)
6. . . **by using another ballot, if you make a mistake and "spoil" your first ballot.** You can spoil up to three ballots. (NCAC 10B.0104b)
7. . . **with assistance from a person of your choice**, except your employer or agent of your union, if you cannot easily read or write or if you are blind or otherwise disabled. (NCGS 163-166.8)
8. . . **with assistance at the curb, in the vehicle you came in**, or at the door of the polling place if the polling place is inaccessible to you due to a disability. (NCGS 163-166.9)
9. . . **if you are in jail, as long as your citizenship has not been forfeited, or if you are an ex-felon** who has completed all terms of your sentence, including parole and probation -- and if you have registered or re-registered to vote. (NCGS 13-1)
10. . . . **without being intimidated** or forced to vote for anyone you don't wish to vote for. (NCGS 163-271).

You also have the right to take this bill of rights into the voting booth with you.

If anyone tries to deny you these rights when you vote, call the Election Protection Hotline at 1-866-OUR-VOTE or 1-866-522-4723.

For Voters with Disabilities:

Sometimes access to your regular polling place can be difficult. If so, you may want to use Early Voting instead, since all Early Voting sites must be accessible. But if you prefer to vote on Election Day, you can vote from the curb without leaving your car. Polling places have a special spot for curbside voting near the front entrance. Simply pull up and wait and a poll worker will come out to assist you. (Usually, voters entering the polls will alert the poll worker that a car is waiting.) Before you go to vote, you may also want to check the accessibility of the polling place by calling the local Board of Elections or the State Board of Elections at 1-866-522-4723. You have the right to request another permanent polling place before the election if yours is inaccessible. Remember, if you go to your polling place and find it is inaccessible, you can vote at any other polling place in the county by asking for a Provisional Ballot.

Make sure every vote counts: Be a part of Election Protection!

True democracy means every voter is respected and every vote counts. To make sure the election is fair, you can be part of a national effort called Election Protection. Election Protection is a coalition of national and state organizations that train local volunteers, monitor elections and help voters who encounter problems or see suspicious activity at polling locations. Based on the information it receives, Election Protection can quickly dispatch lawyers to talk with election or court officials and insist that all election laws are followed and voter's rights are respected. You can volunteer to help in three ways:

1. Be a poll monitor who receives training to look for possible problems;
2. Help staff a hotline in North Carolina that relays problems to lawyers and others;
3. Tell others about the Election Protection Hotline and tell them to call if they have problems: 1-866-OUR-VOTE.
